Helping women shape peace

Malaysia's NAP WPS is being developed using a whole-of-govt and whole-of-society approach

KUALA LUMPUR

THE Women, Family and Community Development Ministry, as the lead agency, today took a proactive step in advancing the Women, Peace and Security (WPS) Agenda by launching Malaysia's first-ever National Action Plan on Women, Peace and Security (NAP WPS) 2025-2030.

The WPS Agenda, established by the United Nations Security Council in 2000, affirms that women are not passive victims of war but indispensable leaders in building sustainable solutions.

Their participation, protection and leadership are the cornerstones of lasting peace. "The WPS Agenda recognises that women are not only victims of conflict but also leaders, peace-makers and key agents of change in ensuring lasting peace," said Women, Family and Community Development Minister Datuk Seri Nancy Shukri.

"Peace cannot be achieved without gender equality. UN studies show that peace agreements are more likely to last at least 15 years when women participate meaningfully."

Malaysia, with its proud legacy in international peacekeeping since the 1960s, has stood at the forefront of these efforts. From Lebanon to Congo, Namibia to Timor-Leste, Malaysian troops, police and medical personnel have served with distinction under the UN flag.

WOMEN'S CONTRIBUTION

As global challenges grow more complex, the nation's continued commitment, together with the inclusion of women's voices, will be pivotal in shaping a more secure and just world.

A significant milestone was achieved in Lebanon under Malbatt, Malaysia's battalion serving with the UN Interim Force in Lebanon (Unifil), where women now comprise 10.5 per cent of the contingent — nearly double the global average for military deployments.

"Last year alone, we recorded our largest deployment of female peacekeepers, with 85 personnel sent to Unifil in Lebanon," said Nancy.

"This achievement earned Malaysia a special award at the 2025 UN Peacekeeping Ministerial in Berlin, recognising our leadership in advancing women's participation in peacekeeping. This global recognition is both an honour and a motivation to continue our work."

Since 2016, Malaysia has also been an active member of the Women, Peace and Security (WPS) Focal Points Network, a platform that brings together governments, regional organisations and UN agencies to exchange best practices and coordinate strategies.

"Being part of the WPS Focal Points Network allows us to highlight Malaysia's contributions to peacekeeping and conflict resolution, as well as share our experiences while learning from others to improve gender inclusion in peacebuilding."

At the regional level, Asean has also taken notable strides in advancing the WPS Agenda.

The adoption of the Asean Regional Plan of Action on WPS (RPA-WPS) provides a clear roadmap for integrating gender perspectives into peace, security and humanitarian initiatives across Southeast Asia.

Nancy said: "Asean has taken sig-

nificant steps by adopting the RPA-WPS in 2022 — the first framework of its kind outside the context of the UN Security Council.

"This shows Asean's leadership in ensuring WPS is not just a global agenda but a regional priority as well."

Complementing this effort is the establishment of the Asean Advisory Group on WPS, a multi-stakeholder platform that unites governments, civil society organisations and experts.

SPOTLIGHT ON LEADERSHIP

Malaysia has played an active role in these developments, consistently lending its voice and experience to

ensure that regional strategies remain both inclusive and practical.

"Peace and security cannot be the responsibility of governments alone. The voices of communities and women at the grassroots level must be involved. That's why the Asean WPS Advisory Group is so important," said Nancy.

Malaysia's leadership will be in the spotlight again when it hosts the Asean 2025 WPS Summit on Sept 9 and 10 in Kuala Lumpur.

Nancy added: "Hosting this summit is both an honour and a responsibility. It reflects our growing leadership in WPS and sends a clear message that peace will be more inclusive and just when women are meaningfully involved."

The government, through the ministry, is now working on a National Action Plan for Women, Peace and Security (NAP WPS).

"UN Secretary-General António Guterres has said national action plans are the best way to translate international commitments into concrete action. We take this seriously," said Nancy.

Malaysia's NAP WPS is being developed using a whole-of-government and whole-of-society approach, involving civil society, academia, youth, the security sector and others. It will be launched during the Asean WPS Summit 2025.

Unlike a plan run by just one ministry, this effort brings together many different groups to better reflect the real experiences of Malaysians while also following global best practices.

Once implemented, the NAP WPS

will act as a guide to make sure women are fully included in decision-making on peace and security.

It also supports the National Women Policy 2025-2030, giving the country a stronger and more coordinated approach to gender equality and women's leadership.

"The NAP WPS is not just about international peacekeeping — it will bring direct benefits to Malaysians. It ensures women are involved in conflict prevention, reconciliation and post-crisis recovery, while also addressing gender-based violence and improving protection in high-risk areas."

A CALL TO CITIZENS

In addition to institutional change, the public also has a vital role to play.

"Citizens can help by joining community programmes like Skwad WAJA, Rukun Tetangga, Amanita, and Jiranita, which prevent gender-based violence."

"They can also support women's participation in local decision-making and engage in awareness and training sessions," Nancy said.

As Asean looks ahead to 2026 and beyond, the upcoming summit will give new energy to efforts that place women's perspectives at the centre of peace and security.

Nancy added: "This summit will reaffirm regional cooperation and allow us to officially announce Malaysia's NAP WPS."

"It will also help Malaysians understand that peace is not just about war — it's about our communities, digital safety, and gender equality."

KUALA LUMPUR, 8 September - Satu Pelan Tindakan Nasional mengenai Wanita, Keamanan dan Keselamatan (WPS) akan diperkenalkan.

Menteri Pembangunan Wanita, Keluarga dan Masyarakat, Datuk Seri Nancy Shukri berkata, ia penting khusus dalam memastikan golongan wanita dilindungi termasuk ketika berlakunya krisis dan bencana.

"Antara tumpuan utama adalah memastikan wanita dan anak perempuan tidak terdedah kepada gangguan seksual atau keganasan.

Kita juga mahu menggalakkan lebih ramai wanita menjadi pemimpin dalam polis, tentera dan komuniti", katanya ketika ditemui selepas menjadi tetamu program Selamat Pagi Malaysia di Angkasapuri di sini, hari ini.

Kementeriannya juga bekerjasama rapat dengan Kementerian Luar Negeri, selain agensi berkaitan termasuk pertahanan, polis dan NGO bagi merangka pelan tersebut.

Ia turut berperanan sebagai rujukan utama semua pihak dalam merangka dasar, latihan dan program berkaitan agenda wanita, keamanan dan keselamatan.

Sementara itu katanya, Malaysia telah menghantar individu wanita ke 39 misi pengaman antarabangsa termasuk di Lubnan, Timor Leste dan Kemboja, sekali gus membuktikan kemampuan kepakaran wanita negara dalam peranan global.

"Kita mahu menunjukkan kepada dunia bahawa wanita Malaysia bukan sahaja berperanan dalam bidang tradisional, tetapi juga dalam bidang teknologi, AI, malah terlibat dalam rundingan keamanan", katanya.

Mengulas penglibatan beberapa selebriti dan berpengaruh tempatan yang menyertai misi kemanusiaan di negara bergolak, beliau menyifatkan tindakan itu sebagai keberanian yang wajar dihargai walaupun berdepan risiko tinggi.

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Wanita Bukan Sekadar Pelengkap... Tetapi Pemimpin Perubahan – Noraini

KUALA LUMPUR, 8 Sept – Timbalan Menteri Pembangunan Wanita, Keluarga dan Masyarakat, Datuk Seri Dr Noraini Ahmad percaya bahawa wanita bukanlah sekadar pelengkap, tetapi pemimpin kepada perubahan.

Menerusi hantaran di laman Facebooknya, Noraini yang juga Ketua Wanita UMNO Malaysia memaklumkan bahawa beliau telah hadir ke Program Pemeraksanaan Wanita MARA dan Seminar Kenegaraan Malaysia Madani Peringkat Kebangsaan pada Ahad.

"Program Pemeraksanaan Wanita MARA dan Seminar Kenegaraan Malaysia Madani Peringkat Kebangsaan telah dirasmikan oleh Datuk Seri Dr Ahmad Zahid Hamidi, Timbalan Perdana Menteri merangkap Menteri Kemajuan Desa dan Wilayah (KKDW).

"Kehadiran beliau memberi makna besar dan tanda sokongan penuh kerajaan terhadap usaha memperkukuh peranan wanita dan

mempertingkatkan semangat kenegaraan," katanya.

Jelasnya, seminar tersebut menyerlahkan betapa pentingnya sokongan berterusan dalam melahirkan lebih ramai usahawan wanita yang berdaya saing.

"Peserta yang hadir ke program ini bukan sekadar datang mendengar, tetapi membawa bersama kisah kejayaan, cabaran dan harapan mereka. Ia membuktikan bahawa wanita mampu berdiri sendiri, mencipta peluang dan membina perniagaan yang memberi impak bukan sahaja kepada ekonomi keluarga, malah menyumbang kepada pembangunan negara.

"Seminar ini juga menyerlahkan betapa pentingnya sokongan berterusan dalam melahirkan lebih ramai usahawan wanita yang berdaya tahan, berinovasi dan mampu menembusi pasaran global.

"Wanita Malaysia hari ini sedang membuktikan bahawa mereka bukan sekadar penggerak ekonomi tempatan, tetapi juga mempunyai potensi besar untuk menjadi pemain utama di pentas antarabangsa," katanya lagi.



Mengulas lanjut, beliau turut menzahirkan ucapan penghargaan kepada MARA yang sentiasa memainkan peranan dalam membantu memperkasa golongan wanita.

"Saya juga ingin menzahirkan ucapan penghargaan buat MARA, sebuah Institusi yang sentiasa konsisten memainkan peranan penting dalam membantu golongan wanita daripada bimbingan, sokongan, pembiayaan hinggalah pelbagai inisiatif strategik. MARA adalah rakan strategik yang memastikan lebih ramai usahawan dan pemimpin wanita lahir, berdaya saing serta mampu maju bersama arus pembangunan negara.

"Turut hadir bersama ialah Datuk Rubiah Wang, Timbalan Menteri KKDW, Datuk Dr Asyraf Wajdi Dusuki, Pengerusi MARA dan Datuk Seri Dr Zambry Abdul Kadir, Menteri Pengajian Tinggi.

"Saya percaya wanita bukan sekadar pelengkap, tetapi pemimpin perubahan. Wanita sedang membuktikan bahawa mereka mampu berada di barisan hadapan, memimpin dengan kebijaksanaan, ketegasan dan penuh jiwa empati. Benarlah kata orang, 'di tangan wanita ada kekuatan membentuk generasi, dan di bahunya terletak kekuatan untuk memimpin perubahan,'" katanya lagi. – *UMNO Online*



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Women in Halal Industry, buka peluang perniagaan besar kepada wanita

Program Pemerkasaan Wanita MARA dan Seminar Kenegaraan Malaysia MADANI Peringkat Kebangsaan telah berlangsung di Dewan Armada Utama, Politeknik Bagan Datuk, Perak.

Timbalan Menteri Pembangunan Wanita, Keluarga dan Masyarakat, Dato' Dr.Noraini Ahmad berkata, ini satu program yang cukup bermakna kerana ia memberi ruang kepada wanita untuk terus menyerlahkan potensi, bukan sekadar diiktiraf sebagai tulang belakang masyarakat, tetapi juga sebagai penggerak utama pembangunan negara.

"Di dalam sesi bual bicara, saya turut berkongsi tentang Women in Halal Industry (WHI) di bawah Halal Development Corporation Berhad (HDC).

"Ianya merupakan sebuah inisiatif yang membuka peluang besar kepada wanita untuk terlibat secara aktif dalam industri halal, sama ada sebagai usahawan, tenaga profesional mahupun peneraju kepimpinan.

"Melalui WHI, wanita bukan sahaja berpeluang meningkatkan pengetahuan dan kemahiran, malah dapat memperkukuh kedudukan mereka dalam sektor halal yang terus berkembang pesat di peringkat global.

"Inilah ruang yang akan memberi manfaat besar, bukan sekadar kepada wanita itu sendiri, tetapi juga kepada keluarga, masyarakat dan negara," jelas Noraini.

Noraini mengucapkan syabas dan tahniah kepada hampir 1,000 orang usahawan wanita yang hadir memenuhi dewan, datang dengan semangat tinggi bersama tekad untuk menimba ilmu, berkongsi pengalaman dan memperkukuh jaringan kerjasama.

"Kehadiran anda membuktikan bahawa wanita sedia melangkah ke hadapan dengan penuh keyakinan," ujar beliau.

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Golongan Ibu tunggal perlu diberi perhatian komuniti setempat

PETALING JAYA – Golongan ibu tunggal yang mempunyai tanggungan perlu diberi dari segi kebajikan kerana mereka antara kelompok yang paling terkesan dengan bebanan kos sara hidup masa kini.

Ahli Majlis, Majlis Bandaraya Petaling Jaya (MBPJ), Ikhsan Mohd Din berkata, masyarakat bertanggungjawab memainkan peranan dengan melaporkan kepada persatuan penduduk atau pihak berkaitan sekiranya terdapat jiran yang memerlukan bantuan.

"Kalau nampak jiran kita susah, perlu bantuan dan sebagainya, jangan dibiarkan. Laporkan segera kepada badan bertanggungjawab supaya bantuan dapat dihulurkan tanpa melengahkan masa," katanya.

Beliau berkata demikian ketika menghadiri program sumbangan komuniti di Apartmen Idaman di sini pada Ahad yang menyaksikan seramai 52 ibu tunggal menerima kotak bantuan keperluan asas daripada syarikat antarabangsa, Archer Daniels Midland Company (ADM).

Turut hadir Penyelia sektor Damansara Damai, Sarjan Mohd Azrul Azizi serta Pengarah program, Zamri Saidin.

Menurutnya, penganjuran itu membuktikan komitmen sektor korporat menerusi program tanggungjawab sosial (CSR) dalam usaha menyantuni golongan asnaf, selain mengukuhkan kerjasama antara komuniti dan pihak berkuasa tempatan.

"Alhamdulillah, walaupun dalam tempoh singkat kita rancang, program ini berjaya mendapat kerjasama baik daripada MBPJ, pihak polis dan komuniti setempat," jelasnya.

Katanya, bantuan yang diberikan dalam bentuk kotak keperluan asas itu mengandungi barangan seperti beras, minyak masak, mihun, telur, gula dan beberapa keperluan dapur lain.

"Ini merupakan kali pertama ADM menyalurkan bantuan di kawasan Damansara Damai. Kita yakin ia akan diteruskan lagi pada masa depan bagi membantu lebih ramai ibu tunggal yang memerlukan," katanya.

Beliau turut menegaskan, program sebegini tidak seharusnya terhenti pada pemberian sumbangan semata-mata sebaliknya perlu disertai dengan perkongsian ilmu bermanfaat kepada masyarakat.

"Kita selitkan juga maklumat berkaitan keselamatan bersama pihak berkuasa dan pengamal undang-undang supaya masyarakat lebih peka terhadap isu keselamatan di sekeliling mereka," ujarnya.

Ikhsan berkata, langkah itu dapat menjadikan sesuatu program lebih berkesan kerana bukan sahaja menyalurkan bantuan, malah meningkatkan tahap kesedaran masyarakat tentang kepentingan saling menjaga antara satu sama lain.

Azalina: Bill expected in Parliament next month

KOTA TINGGI: The Anti-Bullying Tribunal Bill is expected to be tabled in Parliament next month, says Datuk Seri Azalina Othman Said.

The Minister in the Prime Minister's Department (Law and Institutional Reform), who disclosed this, said while she was given six months to prepare the draft, the aim is for it to be completed sooner.

She said with the agreement of several ministers, including Education, Higher Education, Defence and Communications, the target was to complete the engagement roadshow with stakeholders by September.

"Hopefully, we can get a Cabinet decision by the end of September or early October so that we can bring the Bill to Parliament in October," she told reporters after launching the Asean Convention on Legal Aid for Children.

Azalina said engagement sessions were being held to gather views on the Bill from all parties, including legal experts and the public.

"We will also launch a portal as we want to hear from the public who may not have the chance to attend the roadshow.

"We want their views, including whether a tribunal would be better, as it allows for shorter

hearing periods," she said.

Azalina explained that the tribunal was not solely intended to punish, but to provide room for rehabilitation for both the victims and perpetrators through a restorative justice approach.

Deputy Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Ahmad Zahid Hamidi had earlier said Azalina had been given six months to prepare and present the draft proposal on the Anti-Bullying Tribunal Bill to the Cabinet.

In her opening address, Azalina said the recently passed Legal Aid and Public Defence Act 2025

would ensure that all children, regardless of nationality, received legal aid.

"The government strongly believes that legal aid and access to justice must prioritise children, and our strategy from 2026 onwards is to ensure that no child in Malaysia is left unheard, unprotected or unrepresented," she said.

Azalina called on Asean countries to work towards overcoming the shared challenges faced in ensuring access to justice for children.

"Justice should never be seen as

a privilege for a few, it must be a promise for all, especially children.

"In the region, we face similar challenges when it comes to children and access to justice, which include the issue of distance, cost and a lack of awareness," she added.

The minister also expressed hope that the convention would result in cross-border cooperation to build a regional framework for children's legal aid.

Delegates from seven Asean countries are taking part in the three-day convention.

Anti-Bullying Tribunal Bill may be ready by October

KOTA TINGGI: The Anti-Bullying Tribunal Bill is likely to be tabled in Parliament as early as October, ahead of the six-month deadline set by Deputy Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Ahmad Zahid Hamidi, said Minister in the Prime Minister's Department (Law and Institutional Reform) Datuk Seri Azalina Othman Said.

She said her ministry is conducting nationwide roadshows and engagement sessions with stakeholders before presenting the matter to the Cabinet.

"With the agreement of several ministers involved directly and indirectly, such as the Education minister, Higher Education minister, Defence minister and Communications minister, we hope to complete the roadshow this month.

"We aim for a Cabinet decision by the end

of September or early October so that the Bill can be brought to Parliament in October."

She was speaking after opening the inaugural 2025 Asean Convention on Legal Aid for Children at the Desaru Coast Conference Centre on Sunday.

Azalina said through the roadshows, the government wants to gather public views on the proposed tribunal, which is expected to speed up hearings compared with lengthy court processes.

"This tribunal has broader powers. It can examine all aspects and may also consider compensation elements such as fines.

"Punishment may not necessarily involve imprisonment but fines or mandatory courses. So, its scope is wider. The tribunal's key aim, if approved by the government, is speed."

She added that a dedicated portal would

also be launched to collect public feedback, alongside consultations with professional bodies such as the Office of the Children's Commissioner, the Malaysian Bar, state bars, international organisations and relevant experts.

Azalina said the tribunal is not solely intended to punish but also to provide rehabilitation for both victims and perpetrators through a restorative justice approach.

"If we have a fast tribunal system, people will think twice before committing such acts because they know the process is swift. That is why in sexual harassment cases, I observed that under the Sexual Harassment Act, the tribunal system received very positive responses as people knew the process is fast."

'Asean must safeguard rights of children'

KOTA TINGGI: Asean member states must break down barriers that deny children access to justice and work together to strengthen legal aid mechanisms that safeguard their rights, said Minister in the Prime Minister's Department (Law and Institutional Reform) Datuk Seri Azalina Othman Said.

"Justice must never be a privilege for the few but a promise for all, especially our children. Too many barriers still stand in their way – distance, cost and lack of awareness.

"Thus, legal aid must act as the bridge that ensures no child is left unheard, unprotected or unrepresented."

She was speaking at the opening of the inaugural 2025 Asean Convention on Legal Aid for Children on Sunday.

Azalina said Malaysia had taken a significant step when Parliament passed the Legal Aid and Public Defence Bill 2025 in August.

The law guarantees that all children in criminal cases receive proper defence, legal aid to every child regardless of nationality and introduces public defence services under the Legal Aid Department for the first time.

She said while Asean countries had introduced measures such as mobile legal clinics, juvenile courts and *pro bono* networks, gaps in child access to justice remain.

"Therefore, this convention is key to sharing best practices, strengthening cross-border cooperation and building a regional framework for child-friendly legal aid. Let us move from dialogue to action, set Asean-wide standards, train legal professionals, create safe legal spaces and spread legal literacy among families."

The three-day convention features discussions on legal aid for children in civil, criminal and *syariah* cases, international and national perspectives on child-related legal issues as well as strategies to expand access to justice and integrate Asean initiatives into national frameworks.

Seven countries – Malaysia, Brunei, the Philippines, Cambodia, Singapore, Timor-Leste and Vietnam – are participating, with 16 delegates presenting papers on mechanisms, experiences and ideas relating to child legal aid. – Bernama

Down a digital path of destruction

Mum laments sexual exploitation of teen daughter by predators online

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PETALING JAYA: It all started when Anis was taken away by her biological father and exposed to pornography and gambling at the tender age of two.

Alleging that her eldest daughter was molested by her ex-husband's friend, homemaker Siti, 38, from Kuala Lumpur, believes the traumatic experience was what led Anis to become promiscuous and to misbehave.

"I fought to get her back but when she finally came back to me at the age of five, the damage was already done," Siti told The Star.

Now aged 15, Anis has become a blackmail victim after she shared explicit content of herself to older boys and men who hooked her via e-wallet for the material.

From a very early age, Anis was very sociable, hanging out with bad boys and getting kicked out of school, Siti said.

"She would end up getting into trouble, dating older boys, steal-

ing and misbehaving, no matter which school, hostel or private institution I put her in. When she was 12, she was caught masturbating by the school.

"I have tried spending more time with her. I even took her to the hospital but she refused therapy and medication," she said, adding that when Anis was sent to a Welfare Department rehabilitation home, she became suicidal and demanded to leave.

Siti said Anis soon spiralled out of control, having sugar daddies showering her with gifts and money.

"Anis joined Telegram groups that promote promiscuity and was chatting up boys and older men on TikTok."

"These groups are localised, so it is easier to meet and hook up."

"Some of her older boyfriends also groomed her, resulting in sexual relationships."

"They would blackmail Anis, asking her to go into the bathroom where they would record the entire conversation," she said.

Wherever Siti uncovered



something troubling, a confrontation would ensue, resulting in Anis laughing out and running away.

Siti believes Anis, who ran away again in December last year, is able to survive away from home because of the money she gets from the boys and sugar daddies.

She refuses to return and only keeps in contact with her younger sister," Siti said.

Unfortunately Anis' story is not uncommon with the rise of social media.

Lea, a teacher, said secondary school girls selling photos and videos of themselves in sexy and revealing outfits is rampant.

Meanwhile, the boys would

produce obscene content "for fun," she revealed.

"These students are selling their content for hundreds of ruyguit on social media."

"Payment is done via e-wallet, bank account or in cash, so it is difficult to identify what the transaction is for," Lea said, adding that as this is a disciplinary issue, the school deals with it quietly because it does not want to risk parents suing.

She said in some cases, parents may know of their child's online activity but choose to be complex because it is easy money or they are afraid of how the child would react.

Describing the situation as "heartbreaking", Lea said these cases indicate a decline in moral and religious values.

"When we punish them, the parents will accuse us of causing their kids depression and anxiety."

"So what else can teachers do but advise them and pray they stay on the right path?" she said.

On Sept 2, Communications Minister Datuk Fahmi Fadzil said

Meta platforms, the parent company of Facebook, will be summoned to explain the spread of immoral content on its platform.

He said among the issues identified was the dissemination of paedophilia-related content detected under Ops Pedro, involving an online group called "Geng Budak Sekolah", which went viral on WhatsApp and Facebook.

On Aug 19, Home Minister Datuk Seri Saifuddin Nausikov said the Dewan Rakyat that the police had crippled "Geng Budak Sekolah", which was allegedly involved in sexual crimes, including the case of a 12-year-old girl who was jointly operating a website with four of her peers, to sell explicit photos of themselves.

The girl had dropped out of school because her income far exceeded that of her parents, he said, adding that the group had created a WhatsApp group with as many as 762 members.

experience or get caught, they will not be deterred from doing it," he said, adding that there must be more stringent monitoring of digital identities on the Internet as many users are using prepaid and third-party SIMs.

Siti also called for "cyber immorality" provisions to be included in Syariah law to deter creators and producers of level content online.

"TNG Digital, the operator of TNG e-Wallet, said the company is committed to providing a safe, secure and seamless platform for all its users.

"On Dec 20 last year, we implemented 100% electronic Know-Your-Customer verification for all accounts, ensuring that every user completes identity verification before accessing our services."

"Like all payment methods, whether e-wallet, card or cash, the medium itself is neutral."

"What matters most is responsible use, and users should not contravene the platform terms of use, applicable laws or regulations when using the platform," it said, while encouraging parents to play an active role in their chil-

dren's online and financial activities.

To address the needs of younger users, TNG is exploring various options through direct engagement with parents, children and the youth.

"This consultative approach helps us design solutions that balance safety, usability and trust."

"We will share more details once these solutions are ready for rollout," it said.

In Malaysia, the minimum age to register for most e-wallets is 12 years old. Some e-wallets, like eMadani, may have a minimum age of 21 for specific government initiatives.

How can parents protect kids online?

Cyberparenting
Parents can supervise, guide and protect their children when using the Internet and digital devices. This includes monitoring online activities, setting rules, teaching digital safety and helping them understand risks as well as responsibilities. It can help kids enjoy technology without exposure to inappropriate content, cyberbullying, online fraud and other security risks.

Spend time with them online
Create opportunities for your child to have safe and positive online interactions with friends, family and you. Help your child recognise and avoid misinformation and disinformation, age-inappropriate content and content that can potentially cause anxiety or other harm.

Model healthy online habits
Promote positive online behaviour by practising it yourself. Be mindful of the example you set and what you share online about your child, including their photos and videos. Be alert if your child appears to be upset or secretive with online activities. Reassure them that abuse or harassment is never their fault and they shouldn't keep it secret.

Use technology to protect them
Check that your child's device is always updated, running the latest software and privacy settings are on. Set to minimise data collection so that people don't see any information you don't want them to see. Help your child learn to keep personal information private.

'Law alone not enough, teach kids to stay safe'

PETALING JAYA: The Cybercrime Bill, expected to be tabled in Parliament next month, will complement the Cyber Security Act 2024 and allow authorities to clamp down on online sexual offences involving children, legal experts say.

While welcoming the new regulation, lawyer Datuk N. Sivananthan said it may still be difficult to detect the online sale of prohibited materials unless there is a tip-off.

"The reality is that if you are doing this in a private WhatsApp group, no one will know."

"Young people must be educated if we want them to understand how predators are taking advantage of them and how these acts and images will destroy their future."

"They should also be encouraged to provide information to the schools if they know that this is going on," he said.

Sivananthan, who was commenting on children making level online content for money often transferred digitally, urged parents to be alert if substantial payments are received or if their child is displaying signs of having more money than he or she should.

"Unless parents are paying close attention to their child, it's very difficult to know what's going on with them."

"Technology has made it so easy for users to provide sex-related services but difficult for the authorities to detect," he said.

On July 15, Digital Minister Gobind Singh Deo said the Cybercrime Bill is part of ongoing efforts to modernise its legal framework for digital security and strengthen national resilience against rising cyber threats.

He said it will replace outdated laws and equip enforcement agencies with the tools needed to address emerging threats in the digital ecosystem.

Criminal litigator Triptaji Singh said in this new era, everything revolves around technology, with Internet addiction among children now becoming a problem.

Strict parental supervision is crucial,

with rapid technological advancements, particularly in artificial intelligence.

"Ensure your child's safety. Always check what they are looking for online."

"When it comes to children, it all boils down to their circle of friends. Peer pressure is a strong influence."

"Perpetrators take advantage of kids as they are vulnerable and can be lured with gifts or things they value," he said.

Triptaji suggested that parents should activate safe search on Google, create a child account or use parental control software to make the digital space more secure.

Asked if parents should be held accountable in cases of child pornography he said it would depend on whether they are directly involved.

Referring to the Child Act 2001 and Sexual Offences Against Children Act 2017, he said parents can be held accountable if they are negligent in taking reasonable steps to safeguard their child.

"Pornography is illegal in Malaysia under the Penal Code, which includes possession, distribution and production of such illicit materials."

"The Malaysian Communications and Multimedia Commission has blocked pornographic websites but the public including teens and children can still get hands on such content from other sources," he said.

Laws against child porn in Malaysia

- 1) PENAL CODE**
 - a) **Section 292** - Sale, distribution, exhibition or possession of any obscene materials whether it be on object or document.
Penalty: Up to three years imprisonment, a fine, or both.
 - b) **Section 293** - Distribution of any obscene material to individuals under 20 years old.
Penalty: Up to five years imprisonment, a fine, or both.
- 2) COMMUNICATIONS AND MULTIMEDIA ACT 1998**
 - a) **Section 233** - Use of network facilities or services to provide, produce or solicit obscene material online with intent to prey or abuse.
Penalty: Up to one year imprisonment, a RM5,000 fine, or both, plus an additional RM1,000 per day for continued offence.
- 3) SEXUAL OFFENCES AGAINST CHILDREN ACT 2017**
 - a) **Section 5** - Producing or directing child porn.
Penalty: Up to 30 years imprisonment and at least six strokes of whipping.
 - b) **Section 6** - Preparing to produce child porn.
Penalty: Up to 10 years imprisonment and potential whipping.
 - c) **Section 7** - The using of a child to produce child porn.
Penalty: Up to 20 years imprisonment and at least five strokes of whipping or more.
 - d) **Section 8** - Exchanging or publishing child porn.
Penalty: Up to 15 years imprisonment and at least three strokes of whipping.
 - e) **Section 9** - Selling child porn to minors.
Penalty: Up to 15 years imprisonment and at least five strokes of whipping.
 - f) **Section 10** - Possessing or accessing child porn.
Penalty: Up to five years imprisonment, or fine up to RM5,000, or both.

No paper trail, no problem for minors paid via e-wallets

PETALING JAYA: Teens are abusing the ease of e-wallets to charge for level content sold on social media, says child activist Firdaus Aisah.

This, he said, is because there is no strong mechanism to monitor payment transactions made.

Firdaus, who is also a lecturer in management and education, said youth creating and selling sexually-explicit content goes undetected because it is not possible to trace what the payments made are for.

"Parents have no way of monitoring who is paying their child or what the money is for."

"When a child can earn money without their parents' knowledge, why stop?" he said, while calling for tighter e-wallet regulations.

He suggested that transaction notifications should be sent to parents if a user is underage.

Firdaus said he received several case reports involving minors who received money from adults in exchange for sexually explicit content.

"The e-wallet registration age is 12 at the moment. This should be raised and parents must be able to see who is sending money to their child and the amount involved," he said.

Malaysia Cyber Consumer Association (MCCA) president Siti Jalil said e-wallet providers merely offer a financial service - what's more important is to find out where children are learning to create such content.

"Youth posting such content has now been normalised. There are thousands of such accounts on the dark web."

"Most teens are posting links to level content on the social media platform X (formerly Twitter)."

"And unless they go through a traumatic

Exploitation of boys on TikTok under probe

GEORGE TOWN: The Penang Social Welfare Department has launched a preliminary investigation into allegations that a father exploited his two young sons on TikTok.

State Social Development, Welfare and Non-Islamic Affairs Committee chairman Lim Siew Khim said the department had recorded a statement from the man who is popular on social media, and contacted his ex-wife, the children's mother.

"The welfare department received a complaint through the Talian Kasih hotline at 9.30am on Sept 2 alleging exploitation of two boys, aged five and one.

"They were said to have been featured excessively on TikTok to generate income, including through content production, soliciting viewer 'gifts', paid reviews and meet-and-greet sessions."

Lim said the man denied the claims, describing them as a misunderstanding and insisting his children's involvement was voluntary and casual.

"Nevertheless, the welfare department has advised the father to ensure his children's participation remains voluntary and age-appropriate, to limit filming so it does not disrupt their rest, education or emotional wellbeing and to avoid exposing their private lives."

She said the father must prioritise the children's best interests in line with the Child Act 2001 (Act 611), Bernama reported.

She added that the department would continue monitoring the case.

Earlier, media reports said the man, 33, had been summoned to the Southwest District Welfare Office in Balik Pulau to provide a statement.

Bendung Ancaman Terhadap Kanak-kanak

Pendapat mengenai pelbagai isu semasa daripada peneraju pemikiran, hohannis dan pengarang.

Keganasan terhadap kanak-kanak merupakan salah satu isu sosial paling menyayat hati yang semakin mendapat perhatian masyarakat global termasuk di Malaysia.

Dalam sebuah negara yang mendakwa mementingkan pembangunan insan dan kesejahteraan sosial, angka penderaan kanak-kanak yang terus meningkat saban tahun menimbulkan persoalan besar, apakah kita benar-benar melindungi generasi masa depan?

Hakikatnya, dalam dunia yang koncomnya semakin moden dan maju, masih wujud ruang-ruang gelap yang memperlihatkan sisi kejam manusia terhadap golongan paling lemah dan tidak berdaya iaitu kanak-kanak.

Golongan ini sepatutnya dibelai dengan kasih sayang, dilindungi dengan keselamatan dan dibesarkan dalam suasana penuh empati. Namun, realitinya jauh berbeza.

Dalam diam, ribuan kanak-kanak menjadi mangsa penderaan fizikal, seksual, emosi serta pengabaian setiap tahun.

Ibu ini bukan sekadar satu bentuk jenayah, malah satu pengkhianatan terhadap nilai kemanusiaan kerana ia mencerminkan kegagalan institusi keluarga, masyarakat dan negara dalam melindungi generasi masa depan.

Peningkatan Kes Membimbangkan

Menurut laporan Jabatan Kebajikan Masyarakat (JKM), sebanyak 6,144 kes penderaan kanak-kanak telah direkodkan di Malaysia pada tahun 2023, meningkat berbanding 5,348 kes pada tahun sebelumnya.

Ini bermakna, secara purata, terdapat kira-kira 17 kes penderaan kanak-kanak dilaporkan setiap hari. Daripada jumlah itu, penderaan fizikal menduduki tangga teratas, diikuti penderaan seksual dan emosi.

Statistik ini hanyalah 'puncak gunung ais' kerana banyak lagi kes yang tidak dilaporkan atas pelbagai faktor seperti ketakutan, rasa malu, atau tidak mengetahui saluran aduan.

Situasi ini amat membimbangkan kerana ia menunjukkan bahawa keganasan terhadap kanak-kanak bukan sahaja berlaku secara meluas, tetapi juga berakar dalam sistem sosial kita yang longgar dari segi perlindungan.

Peningkatan ini bukan sahaja membimbangkan, malah membuktikan bahawa masih banyak

Keganasan terhadap kanak-kanak tidak semestinya berlaku dalam bentuk fizikal atau seksual semata-mata.

Penderaan emosi seperti dimaki, dihina, diugut atau diabaikan juga memberi kesan jangka panjang yang parah.

Kajian UNICEF Malaysia (2022) menunjukkan bahawa hampir 30% kanak-kanak di Malaysia mengaku pernah mengalami penderaan emosi, kebanyakannya berlaku di rumah.

Kesan Sepanjang Hayat

Mereka membesar dalam suasana ketakutan, rasa tidak disayangi dan hilang keyakinan diri akibat penghinnaan dan kekosongan kasih sayang, satu permulaan hidup yang jauh dari ideal.

Penderaan jenis ini jarang meninggalkan kesan luaran yang boleh dilihat, namun luka di dalam hati dan minda mereka lebih dalam dan sukar disembuhkan.

Menurut pakar psikologi kanak-kanak, kesan penderaan bukan sahaja menjejaskan perkembangan emosi dan sosial, malah ia menjadi benih kepada pelbagai masalah lain apabila mereka meningkat remaja seperti kemurungan, kegagalan akademik, dan kecenderungan kepada jenayah atau penyalahgunaan dadah.

Dalam erti kata lain, setiap kanak-kanak yang gagal dilindungi hari ini berpotensi menjadi masalah sosial pada masa hadapan. Punca berlakunya keganasan terhadap kanak-kanak sangat kompleks dan pelbagai.

Antaranya ialah tekanan hidup seperti kemiskinan, masalah kewangan, masalah rumah tangga seperti penceraihan, ketagihan alkohol atau dadah serta masalah kesihatan mental ibu bapa atau penjaga.

Kejahilan tentang kaedah keibubapaan menyebabkan sesetengah ibu bapa masih percaya bahawa mendidik dengan kekerasan adalah cara terbaik untuk mendisiplinkan anak.

Di samping itu, norma budaya dan sikap masyarakat yang lebih suka 'tidak masuk campur urusan orang lain' di samping kehadiran budaya 'tutup mata' dalam masyarakat menyebabkan banyak kes penderaan berterusan tanpa halangan.

Malah, dalam sesetengah komuniti, penderaan dianggap sebagai 'perkara biasa' yang tidak perlu dibesar-besarkan.

Dalam banyak kes, jiran atau ahli keluarga sebenarnya mengetahui penderaan berlaku, tetapi memilih untuk tidak campur tangan atas alasan "itu hal keluarga orang lain".

Perlu Pendekatan Holistik

Untuk menangani masalah ini, pendekatan holistik dan menyeluruh diperlukan. Paling utama, sistem undang-undang perlu diperkasa.

Akta Kanak-Kanak 2001 perlu dikaji semula agar hukuman terhadap pelaku keganasan lebih berat dan memberi kesan jangka panjang.

Selanjutnya, pendidikan mengenai hak kanak-kanak dan keibubapaan perlu diperluas, termasuk di sekolah dan komuniti.

Masyarakat perlu dididik bahawa memukul, menjerit, atau mengugut anak bukanlah satu bentuk 'mendidik', tetapi satu bentuk penderaan.

Selain itu, saluran pelaporan perlu dipermudah dan diperluas. Contohnya, perubahan talian khas seperti Talian Kasih 15999 harus dipromosikan secara meluas agar kanak-kanak tahu ke mana harus mengadu.

Malah, kerjasama antara agensi kerajaan, NGO, sekolah dan masyarakat perlu diperkukuh untuk membentuk rangkaian perlindungan yang cekap.

Untuk menangani masalah ini, pendekatan menyeluruh perlu dilaksanakan. Pendidikan mengenai hak kanak-kanak perlu diperkasakan bukan hanya kepada ibu bapa, tetapi juga kepada kanak-kanak itu sendiri.

Sistem pendidikan perlu memasukkan modul hak kanak-kanak, pengurusan emosi dan keselamatan diri.

Malah, kempen kesedaran secara besar-besaran melalui media arus perdana dan media sosial mesti digerakkan secara konsisten dan berterusan, bukan hanya apabila berlaku kes berprofil tinggi.

Selain itu, peranan media juga penting. Media harus memainkan fungsi mendidik masyarakat melalui laporan yang beretika dan tidak sensasi.

Ini bermakna daripada hanya melaporkan kes, media boleh berperanan sebagai agen perubahan sosial melalui laporan berbentuk pencegahan, pendidikan dan advokasi.

Cerita mangsa penderaan tidak seharusnya hanya menjadi tajuk sensasi semata-mata, tetapi perlu diiringi dengan penyelesaian dan lantikan terhadap pihak berwajib.

Penyebaran maklumat yang tepat dan menyentuh emosi juga mampu membangkitkan kesedaran awam.

Sebagai contoh, dokumentari pendek, drama televisyen, dan kempen media sosial boleh digunakan untuk menyebarkan mesej anti-keganasan terhadap kanak-kanak dengan lebih berkesan.

Dalam dunia digital hari ini, media berpengaruh besar dalam membentuk pandangan dan sikap masyarakat, justeru perannya tidak boleh dipandang ringan.

Akhir sekali, ibu bapa dan penjaga harus sedar bahawa membesarkan anak bukan hanya tanggungjawab fizikal, tetapi juga emosi dan rohani.

Anak bukanlah milik mutlak ibu bapa untuk diperlakukan sesuka hati. Mereka adalah amanah Tuhan dan bakal pewaris negara. Jika hari ini kita gagal melindungi mereka, maka kita sedang merosakkan generasi masa depan.

Pepatah Melayu ada mengatakan, "anak ibarat kain putih, ibu bapalah yang mencorakannya." Jika coraknya penuh luka dan trauma, maka lahiriah masyarakat yang picung dan hilang nilai kemanusiaan.

Natijahnya keganasan terhadap kanak-kanak bukan isu peribadi atau isu keluarga semata-mata, ia adalah isu kemanusiaan dan tanggungjawab kolektif.

Setiap kanak-kanak yang kita gagal lindungi hari ini adalah cerminan kelemahan kita sebagai masyarakat.

Kesimpulan

Kesimpulannya, keganasan terhadap kanak-kanak adalah isu besar yang tidak boleh dipandang ringan. Ia bukan sahaja mencederakan tubuh kecil mereka, tetapi juga menghancurkan harapan dan masa depan.

Tindakan segera, bersepadu dan berkesan perlu dilaksanakan agar kanak-kanak dapat membesar dalam persekitaran yang sihat, selamat dan penuh kasih sayang.

Sebuah negara yang benar-benar maju bukan diukur melalui pencakar langit atau lebuh raya canggih, tetapi melalui bagaimana ia menjaga dan melindungi anak-anaknya.

Sudah tiba masanya kita hentikan luka yang tak terlihat ini. Setiap suara, setiap tindakan, dan setiap pilihan kita hari ini menentukan sama ada kanak-kanak Malaysia akan membesar dalam pelukan kasih atau terus terperangkap dalam bayang-bayang pengabaian serta penderaan yang gelap dan sunyi.

KUALA LUMPUR, 8 September – Prasarana Malaysia Berhad (Prasarana) sedang mengkaji pelaksanaan 'Platform Automatic Gate System' (PAGS) di stesen Transit Aliran Ringan (LRT) Laluan Kelana Jaya dan LRT Laluan Ampang bagi memastikan insiden melibatkan penumpang Orang Kurang Upaya (OKU) di Stesen LRT Titiwangsa pada 22 Februari lalu tidak berulang.

Timbalan Menteri Pengangkutan, Datuk Hasbi Habibollah berkata, kementeriannya sentiasa memastikan bahawa setiap insiden disiasat secara teliti bagi mengenal pasti punca di samping melaksanakan langkah pembaikan serta pencegahan dengan kadar segera.

Beliau berkata, beberapa langkah interim juga telah diambil untuk meningkatkan tahap keselamatan di stesen pengangkutan awam yang lain.

"Antaranya adalah pemasangan penghadang keselamatan sementara di stesen-stesen LRT Laluan Kelana Jaya dan LRT Laluan Ampang dan penempatan anggota polis bantuan tambahan di stesen-stesen tren.

"Selain itu, mempertingkatkan kemudahan mesra OKU di seluruh rangkaian pengangkutan awam, termasuk menggantikan lif-lif lama dengan lif baharu yang dilengkapi dengan kemudahan mesra OKU di stesen-stesen Monorel dan penambahbaikan laluan akses serta papan tanda lebih jelas bagi memastikan pergerakan yang selesa dan selamat kepada penumpang OKU," katanya.

Namun, populariti itu datang bersama sisi gelap yang tidak boleh disapu di bawah permaidani.

Dakwaan bahawa platform ini gagal melindungi kanak-kanak daripada pemangsa seksual bukan perkara kecil.

Ia adalah amaran keras betapa syarikat teknologi sering meletakkan keuntungan melebihi keselamatan pengguna paling rapuh iaitu anak-anak kita.

Berapa lama lagi kita mahu terus percaya janji manis syarikat gergasi teknologi bahawa mereka 'komited menjaga keselamatan pengguna'?

Hakikatnya, kes demi kes menunjukkan kelemahan serius.

Apabila negeri Louisiana di Amerika Syarikat sanggup memfailkan saman kerana Roblox didakwa memudahkan eksploitasi kanak-kanak, itu bukti jelas masalahnya sudah parah.

Dunia maya yang kononnya penuh kreativiti rupa-rupanya boleh bertukar menjadi sarang pedofilia jika syarikat hanya mengutamakan bilangan pemain dan pulangan pelaburan.

Kerajaan Malaysia tidak boleh bersikap tunggu dan lihat. Undang-undang kawalan umur di Britain dan Eropah patut dijadikan teladan segera.

SKMM mesti lebih tegas mendesak syarikat teknologi antarabangsa supaya memikul tanggungjawab, bukan sekadar menabur kata-kata manis.

Jika mereka boleh meraih untung jutaan ringgit daripada pengguna di negara ini, mereka juga wajib memastikan keselamatan anak-anak kita.

Namun, ibu bapa jangan mudah terleka. Memberi gajet tanpa pengawasan ibarat menyerahkan kunci rumah kepada orang asing.

Kawal masa skrin, kenali permainan yang dimainkan anak, dan berani berkata tidak jika ia membawa risiko.

Dunia digital tidak pernah neutral. Sama ada ia menjadi ruang ilmu atau lubuk jenayah bergantung pada sejauh mana kita berani menuntut akauntabiliti daripada syarikat teknologi yang rakus.

Ingatlah, anak-anak bukan sekadar pengguna aplikasi, bahan mereka amanah yang mesti dilindungi dengan segala upaya.

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15 individu termasuk ibu kanak-kanak lemas diambil keterangan

SEREMBAN: Polis sudah mengambil keterangan 15 saksi termasuk ibu kepada dua kanak-kanak yang ditemui lemas dalam kenderaan di Sungai Linggi, Khamis lalu.

Ketua Polis Negeri Sembilan, Datuk Alzafny Ahmad, berkata siasatan penuh masih dijalankan termasuk berkaitan status pengislaman kedua-dua mangsa.

“Siasatan masih diteruskan untuk dilengkapkan. Setakat ini 15 keterangan saksi sudah diambil, termasuk bekas isteri yang juga ibu kepada kedua-dua kanak-kanak itu. Termasuk saksi yang berada di tempat kejadian serta saksi yang boleh membantu siasatan.

“Status pengislaman kanak-kanak ini masih dalam siasatan Jabatan Hal Ehwal Islam Negeri Sembilan (JHEAINS),” katanya dalam kenyataan, hari ini.

Beliau berkata, bedah siasat terhadap kedua-dua mangsa dijalankan pada 5 September lalu dan mendapati punca kematian adalah akibat lemas, selain tiada unsur kekerasan.

Setakat ini, katanya, dua suspek iaitu bapa mangsa dan teman wanitanya ditahan reman tujuh hari bermula 5 September hingga 11 September ini bagi membantu siasatan lanjut.

Orang ramai yang mempunyai maklumat atau melihat kejadian diminta tampil membantu siasatan.

GUILTY PLEA

Vendor gets 7 years' jail, 2 strokes of rotan for raping minor

MUAR: A snack vendor was sentenced to seven years' imprisonment and two strokes of the rotan after pleading guilty to raping his sister-in-law's 12-year-old stepdaughter.

Judge Sayani Mohd Nor sentenced the 32-year-old at the Sessions Court here yesterday.

The court considered the submissions from both parties before convicting him under Section 376(1) of the Penal Code, which carries a maximum penalty of 20 years' imprisonment.

According to the charge, the incident occurred at a house in Batu Pahat at 3am in April 2022.

Police launched an investigation after the victim's school principal lodged a report on Aug 13 that girl had been raped.

The prosecution was led by deputy public prosecutor Othman Affan Ismail.

The defendant was unrepresented.

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Lelaki dipenjar 7 tahun, dua sebatan kerana rogol anak angkat adik ipar

Hakim Sayani Mohd Nor menjatuhkan hukuman itu terhadap tertuduh berusia 32 tahun selepas meneliti hujahan serta rayuan kedua-dua pihak bagi mensabitkan tertuduh dengan kesalahan terbabit.

Mengikut pertuduhan, lelaki terbabit didakwa merogol mangsa berusia 12 tahun (ketika kejadian) di sebuah rumah di Batu Pahat, jam 3 pagi, pada April 2022.

Tertuduh didakwa mengikut Seksyen 376 (1) Kanun Keseksaan yang memperuntukkan hukuman penjara sehingga 20 tahun dan sebatan jika sabit kesalahan.

Berdasarkan fakta kes, polis menerima laporan daripada pengetua sekolah mangsa pada 13 Ogos lalu memaklumkan pelajar itu dirogol abang iparnya yang juga tertuduh.

Siasatan awal polis mendapati mangsa adalah anak angkat kepada adik ipar tertuduh dengan kejadian berlaku ketika remaja itu terjaga dan ke tandas untuk membuang air.

Ketika itu, tertuduh berada di ruang tamu menonton televisyen. Tertuduh mengekori mangsa ke dalam biliknya sebelum menarik seluar mangsa.

Pada masa sama, tertuduh menutup mulut mangsa dengan tangan agar jeritannya tidak didengari ahli keluarga lain.

Mangsa pernah menceritakan kejadian kepada ibu angkatnya, namun tidak diendahkan sebaliknya dituduh membuat fitnah.

Kejadian itu terbongkar apabila pihak sekolah menjumpai nota ditulis mangsa dan mangsa menceritakan kejadian selepas ditanya sebelum pihak sekolah membuat laporan polis.

Laporan dibuat pada 1 September lalu dan mangsa dibawa ke Hospital Sultanah Nora Ismail (HSNI) untuk rawatan.

Pendakwaan dikendalikan Timbalan Pendakwa Raya Othman Affan Ismail, manakala tertuduh tidak diwakili peguam.
