KUCHING: Ahli Parlimen Santubong, Datuk Seri Nancy Shukri menyuarakan bantahan keras ke atas penggunaan nama 'Santubong' pada produk arak yang tular di media sosial.

Nancy pada mulanya berkongsi hantaran seorang pengguna Facebook – Apiq Noend, yang menzahirkan rasa tidak setuju ke atas penjenamaan arak menggunakan nama kawasan berkenaan.

Dalam kenyataan susulannya, Nancy menegaskan tindakan itu jelas tidak menjaga sensitiviti masyarakat setempat dan mendesak agar pihak berkuasa mengambil tindakan segera.

"Saya sangat setuju. Jelas sekali tidak menjaga sensitiviti masyarakat Santubong yang majoritinya beragama Islam.

"Pihak berkuasa wajar mengambil tindakan tegas," katanya.

Beliau yang juga Menteri Pembangunan Wanita, Keluarga dan Masyarakat menambah, aspek perundangan turut akan diteliti bagi memastikan pengeluar produk terbabit mematuhi undang-undang.

"Kami juga akan semak dari segi perundangan sama ada pengeluar produk mematuhi undang-undang berkaitan," jelasnya.

Isu tersebut turut mengundang pelbagai reaksi netizen di media sosial. Salah seorang pengguna berpendapat, arak merupakan perkara sensitif yang tidak wajar dikaitkan dengan nama Santubong.

"Arak merupakan isu sensitif. Kalau digunakan untuk produk lain mungkin tidak timbul isu.

"Walaupun niat dah betul nak memperkenalkan Santubong, tetapi dalam isu agama, arak merupakan isu yang sensitif kerana benda haram," tulisnya.

Seorang lagi pengguna pula berpendapat penjenamaan sedemikian tidak wajar walaupun niat asalnya mungkin baik.

"Mempromosi produk dengan tempat? Terangkan dengan jelas maksud yang munasabah niat atau sesuatu perkara itu sama ada baik atau tidak?

"Dari perspektif, ia memang tidak wajar, mempromosi tempat yang majoriti masyarakatnya ialah Muslim dengan arak, walaupun tujuan asal adalah baik,"ujarnya.

Empowering women key to sustainable Asean, says Cambodian assembly president

KUALA LUMPUR: A sustainable Asean cannot be realised without empowering women and embedding gender equality across every level of society, including in the digital and green economies, Cambodian National Assembly President Samdech Maha Rathsapheathika Thipadei Khuon Sudary said today.

Speaking at the 2nd WAIPA Women Political Leaders Forum, held in conjunction with the 46th Asean Inter-Parliamentary Assembly (AIPA) General Assembly here, Khuon Sudary said women's leadership was critical to ensuring that Asean remained resilient, inclusive and sustainable in the face of global challenges.

"We need holistic and inclusive solutions, and women are obviously part of the solution. Women's leadership does not destroy – however, women and girls around the world face multiple pressures and challenges rooted in inequality and discrimination.

"To realise a sustainable Asean we must empower women and promote gender equality at every level and across all sectors, including the digital economy and green economy," she said.

She said governments worldwide were facing unprecedented pressures – from geopolitical rivalries and economic disruption to climate change, technological shifts and social fragmentation – and argued that women were integral to overcoming them.

Governance, she added, must move away from rigid, top-down models and evolve into more flexible, adaptive and inclusive approaches that take into account diverse voices.

"Agile governance allows institutions to respond more effectively to people's needs and considerations. Women and girls are essential to that process," she said.

Khuon Sudary said there is a need for parliaments to play a more active role in advancing gender equality.

"This includes passing laws to prohibit violence against women in politics, strengthening internal parliamentary mechanisms to investigate discrimination, and introducing measures such as quotas to ensure greater female representation in decision-making," she said.

She added that a "gender-sensitive parliament" was not just a symbolic goal but a necessity for effective governance.

"A gender-sensitive parliament, one that reflects the evolving demands of modern society, is more effective and capable of addressing contemporary challenges," she said.

Beyond lawmaking, she urged parliaments to integrate gender perspectives into budgeting and oversight functions, ensuring that policies and resources directly benefit women and marginalised groups.

Committees, audits and inquiries, she said, must be designed to mainstream gender considerations and translate legal frameworks into concrete changes.

She also underlined the importance of nurturing women's leadership across political parties and civil society, noting that strong networks of female leaders and volunteers could amplify women's voices and strengthen democratic participation across the region.

Khuon Sudary reminded delegates that the push for gender equality was not only a matter of fairness but also a foundation for Asean's long-term strength.

"Advancing gender equality within parliamentary systems is fundamental to building a resilient, inclusive and sustainable Asean community.

"We, as parliamentarians, must work closely together to achieve this goal," she said.

The Women Political Leaders Forum is part of the week-long AIPA General Assembly, which has brought together 25 delegations, including nine Asean member states, 13 observer countries and Timor-Leste.

Also present were AIPA President and Dewan Rakyat Speaker Tan Sri Dr Johari Abdul, Women Parliamentarians of AIPA (WAIPA) chairperson and Dewan Rakyat Deputy Speaker Alice Lau, Women, Family and Community Development Deputy Minister Datuk Seri Dr Noraini Ahmad, and AIPA Secretary-General Siti Rozaimeryanty Datuk Haji Abdul Rahman.

Diskriminasi digital ancam kepimpinan wanita ASEAN

KUALA LUMPUR: Pemimpin wanita kini berdepan bentuk diskriminasi baharu melalui platform digital selain gangguan berasaskan jantina yang masih membelenggu golongan itu.

Pengerusi Ahli Parlimen Wanita AIPA (WAIPA), Alice Lau Kiong Yieng berkata, perkara itu menuntut tindakan kolektif ahli parlimen anggota ASEAN bagi mewujudkan persekitaran politik yang lebih selamat dan inklusif.

Beliau berkata, ruang digital sememangnya membuka peluang luas kepada wanita namun pada masa sama mendedahkan golongan itu kepada cabaran diskriminasi moden.

"Ruang digital turut mendedahkan pemimpin wanita kepada bentuk diskriminasi baharu.

"Justeru itu, ia memerlukan perhatian serius kerana boleh mengekang penglibatan aktif wanita dalam kepimpinan politik dan proses membuat keputusan," katanya.

Beliau berkata demikian ketika berucap pada Forum Kepimpinan Politik Wanita WAIPA ke-2 yang diadakan bersempena Perhimpunan Agung AIPA ke-46 di Pusat Dagangan Dunia hari ini.

Alice berkata, kemajuan kepimpinan wanita bukan hanya bergantung kepada golongan itu semata-mata, sebaliknya merupakan tanggungjawab bersama kerajaan, parlimen dan masyarakat untuk membina masa hadapan serantau yang lebih inklusif.

Katanya, peranan WAIPA sejak penubuhannya terbukti menjadi platform penting dalam memajukan agenda kepimpinan wanita menerusi perkongsian pengalaman, membina solidariti dan mendorong reformasi di seluruh ASEAN.

"Kemajuan kepimpinan wanita bukanlah tugas wanita semata-mata. Ia adalah tanggungjawab bersama kerajaan, parlimen dan masyarakat.

"Dalam hal ini, AIPA dan WAIPA menyediakan platform penting untuk berkongsi pengalaman, membina solidariti serta mempromosikan reformasi yang memperkasakan Ahli Parlimen wanita di seluruh rantau ini," katanya.

Menurutnya, era digital menuntut usaha menutup jurang gender agar tiada golongan yang tercicir, manakala peralihan menuju kelestarian pula menjadikan kepimpinan wanita sebagai elemen utama dalam mencorakkan dasar mampan.

Katanya, perspektif wanita lazimnya menekankan daya tahan komuniti, tanggungjawab merentas generasi serta nilai inklusif yang boleh mengukuhkan tadbir urus dalam menangani perubahan iklim dan pembangunan mampan.

"Marilah kita meneroka strategi praktikal bagi meningkatkan penyertaan wanita daripada pembangunan kepimpinan, penggubalan undang-undang yang responsif gender hinggalah kepada kerjasama serantau yang menghubungkan agenda digital dan kelestarian.

"Dengan memperkasa pemimpin wanita, kita bukan sahaja mengangkat separuh daripada masyarakat, malah turut mencipta demokrasi yang lebih kukuh, komuniti lebih berdaya tahan serta masa hadapan yang lebih cerah untuk semua," katanya. –

IPOH – Kajian berhubung kepimpinan wanita sebagai ibu yang dilaksanakan di Perak bakal menjadi panduan penting kerajaan negeri dalam merangka program menjurus ke arah sejahtera sosial seperti digariskan dalam pelan Perak Sejahtera 2030.

Kajian bertajuk Pengaruh Kepimpinan Ibu Terhadap Motivasi Belajar Anak-Anak di Perak: Penghargaan Kendiri Ibu Sebagai Mediator oleh Universiti Sains Malaysia (USM) itu telah mengenal pasti beberapa dapatan penting berkaitan kepimpinan ibu di negeri ini.

Dapatan kajian memberi gambaran yang jelas mengenai peranan ibu sebagai pemimpin dalam organisasi keluarga dan bagaimana gaya kepimpinan mereka memberi impak kepada perkembangan akademik anak-anak.

Antara penemuan diperolehi menerusi kajian berkenaan adalah beban mendidik anak lebih banyak dipikul oleh isteri berbanding suami di samping kekangan masa dan tahap keyakinan rendah dalam membantu akademik anak.

Ketua penyelidik, Profesor Madya Dr Aziah Ismail berkata, kajian berbentuk tinjauan soal selidik itu melibatkan 400 pasangan ibu dan anak di pelbagai lokaliti termasuk bandar, luar bandar, pedalaman, sekolah Orang Asli serta kawasan FELDA di Perak.

“Setengah ibu merasakan tanggungjawab mendidik lebih tertumpu kepada mereka tanpa sokongan mencukupi daripada pasangan.

“Tekanan emosi ini boleh menjejaskan keupayaan mereka berperanan sebagai pemimpin dalam keluarga,” katanya ketika membentangkan dapatan kajian di Dewan Auditorium Kompleks Kementerian Dalam Negeri di sini baru-baru ini.

Di dalam buku kajian yang dihasilkan turut mengemukakan beberapa cadangan tindakan antaranya menyediakan latihan kemahiran keibubapaan berdasarkan pendekatan kepimpinan yang berkesan.

Selain itu, ibu yang mengalami tekanan dan kesukaran dalam menguruskan anak-anak mereka perlu diberikan sokongan psikologi serta beberapa saranan berkaitan turut dicadangkan.

Sementara itu, Exco Pembangunan Wanita, Keluarga, Kebajikan Masyarakat, Pembangunan Usahawan dan Koperasi Perak, Datuk Salbiah Mohamed menegaskan kerajaan negeri menyambut baik dapatan tersebut yang disifatkan sebagai kajian pertama seumpamanya di negeri ini.

Katanya, hasil data itu menjadi asas penting dalam menggubal program lebih berkesan, bukan hanya bergantung kepada andaian atau laporan tidak rasmi.

“Dengan kajian ini, kita dapat melihat punca sebenar masalah yang dihadapi ibu termasuk aspek sokongan sosial, kesihatan mental dan kefahaman tentang tanggungjawab mendidik anak.

“Kepimpinan wanita bukan sahaja dalam organisasi, malah bermula dalam keluarga. Dari sinilah lahirnya kesejahteraan masyarakat dan masa depan negara,” katanya.

Kajian berkenaan dibiayai oleh kerajaan negeri melalui Sekretariat Pembangunan Wanita dan Masyarakat Negeri Perak, ia dibuka untuk digunakan pelbagai pihak sekali gus menegaskan kepentingan data dalam memperkukuh dasar pembangunan sosial negeri.

Malacca plans sports event for special needs children

MALACCA: The state government here plans to introduce a sports event for children with special needs starting next year, as part of efforts to expand existing sports development programmes.

State Youth, Sports and Non-Governmental Organisations Committee chairman Datuk V.P. Shanmugam said Chief Minister Datuk Seri Ab Rauf Yusoh recently called for the introduction of sports dedicated to the group.

He said the initiative would give children with disabilities the chance to take part in sporting activities suited to their abilities.

“At present, Malacca already holds three major events – the Malacca Games, State Secretary’s Office Games and the Uniformed Bodies Games. From next year, we plan to add the Special Children’s Games.”

Shanmugam said the state government would also work with associations representing children with special needs to identify suitable sports events and collect data on participants before launching the programme officially.

He also said the initiative would not only encourage children with special needs to participate in sports, but also help build their confidence and foster a spirit of inclusion in society. – Bernama

BANDA HILIR 17 September – Ibu bapa di negeri ini disaran untuk menghantar anak-anak mereka ke taman asuhan kanak-kanak (taska) berdaftar yang ada di seluruh negeri bagi menjamin hak anak-anak mendapat pendidikan awal berkualiti.

Exco Pembangunan Wanita, Keluarga dan Komuniti negeri Datuk Kalsom Noordin berkata, setakat Ogos 2025, sejumlah 150 taska berdaftar telah direkodkan di bawah Jabatan Kebajikan Masyarakat (JKM) Negeri Melaka.

Jelas beliau, kesemua taska berdaftar itu bukan sahaja, patuh kepada piawaian keselamatan dan kebajikan, malah turut menyediakan pengawasan pengasuh terlatih.

“Justreru, saya amat menekankan kepentingan menghantar anak-anak ke taska berdaftar memandangkan ibu bapa dapat menghantar anak-anak dengan penuh keyakinan.

“Pada masa sama, anak-anak pula dapat menikmati proses pembelajaran dan perkembangan dalam persekitaran yang selamat dan terjamin,” katanya.

Beliau berkata demikian ketika berucap pada Majlis Perasmian Hari Taska Peringkat Negeri Melaka yang bertemakan ‘Hak Bermain, Anak-Anak Ceria’ di Mahkota Parade, di sini, pada Ahad.

Hadir sama, Timbalan Exco Pembangunan Wanita, Keluarga dan Komuniti negeri Leng Chau Yen; Pengarah JKM Negeri Melaka Halyah Muhamad; Presiden Persatuan Taska dan PJKK Negeri Melaka Kenneth William John serta lain-lain kenamaan.

NET TIGHTENING ON CHILD PREDATORS

Tech that they use to hide themselves can be used to bring them down, says cybercrime expert

ENCRYPTED chats, anonymous forums and gaming platforms: Child predators are exploiting every corner of the digital world to spread child sexual abuse material (CSAM) and groom victims.

However, cybercrime hunters say the net is tightening.

A former cybercrime contractor who helped set up Bukit Aman's Technical and Tactical Cyber Unit's digital systems described the landscape as nothing less than a digital battlefield.

"These predators think encryption shields them, but every click leaves a trail. The same technology that hides them can also bring them down," the source told the *New Straits Times* (NST).

Behind their avatars and pseudonyms, offenders lurk in hidden forums, private chat groups and gaming communities popular with children.

Grooming often begins with small lures, such as free game credits, extra attention or promises, before escalating into exploitation.

The source said predators including paedophiles, relied on encrypted platforms and pseudonyms to circulate CSAM, believing they could hide behind layers of digital protection.

WEAPONS IN THE BATTLEFIELD

Malaysia's defences include the Malaysian Communications and Multimedia Commission (MCMC) and CyberSecurity Malaysia, which monitor harmful content via the Cyber999 hotline.

Cases are escalated to police when crimes are confirmed.

In December last year, under Op Pedo Bersepadu PDRM-MCMC, police arrested 13 people in a series of raids in Selangor, Kuala Lumpur, Penang, Perak, Johor and Terengganu.

The operation involved Bukit Aman's Sexual, Women and

Child Investigation Division (D11) and MCMC.

More than 40,000 pieces of CSAM and pornographic content were found.

The NST's investigation found that CSAM content was being sold for as low as RM1 per video.

D11 principal assistant director Senior Assistant Commissioner Siti Kamsiah Hassan had said easy access to such pornography material made predators more brazen, with some even attempting to abduct children.

Several other borderless agencies also hunt child predators. Beyond Malaysia's borders, global law enforcement has turned the fight into a collective campaign.

The International Criminal Police Organisation (Interpol) is the world's largest police body with 196 members. It runs databases like the International Child Sexual Exploitation to track and identify victims and offenders.

The Association of Southeast Asian Nations Chiefs of Police (Aseanapol) is a regional network linking the 10 Asean countries. It shares intelligence and coordinates operations against cross-border crime, including child exploitation.

The United States' Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), through its Crimes Against Children and Human Trafficking Unit, provides behavioural profiling, digital forensics and international cooperation to dismantle online exploitation networks. The source said Interpol, Aseanapol and the FBI were key partners in tracing CSAM that flowed across borders.

"The Internet has no borders. Neither should law enforcement."

STATISTICS PAINT A GRIM PICTURE

Data from the Statistics Department reveal that there were 1,567 cases of sexual offences involving children in 2023, a 26.5 per cent rise from the previous year, while child pornography cases surged 139 per cent year-on-year.

Between 2018 and May 2024, police opened more than 7,700 investigation papers into child sexual offences.

"These are only reported cases. The real numbers are almost certainly higher, as many children remain silent or parents never realise abuse has occurred," said the source.

Bukit Aman Criminal Investigation Department director Datuk M. Kumar had reminded parents and the public to be vigilant.

"If you encounter suspicious content, do not download or forward it. Note the link or profile and report immediately to Cyber999 or the police. Victims and families can seek help via Talian Kasih 15999," the source said.

"CSAM is not just an online crime. Behind every file is a child's life shattered. Stopping it requires all of us."

Experts warned that paedophiles often led "double lives" — respected in public but ruthless online.

Human Rights Commission of Malaysia children's commissioner chief Dr Farah Nimi Dussali said the authorities should detect potential abusers, adding that victims must also be given consistent counselling.

Malaysia's child safety net has holes, experts say kids at risk

Background checks on adoptive parents should be thorough and include psychological evaluations, while post-adoption monitoring should be mandatory and frequent to ensure the child's safety.

SHAH ALAM – When it comes to protecting children from predators, the first line of defence is not always the police, it is teachers, parents, doctors and social workers.

Yet experts warned that these first lines of defence were often unprepared to identify and report cases of exploitation.

Criminologist and principal consultant of Arunachala Research and Consultancy Sdn Bhd R. Paneir Selvam said schools, parents and frontline professionals played a crucial role in preventing abuse but faced significant challenges.

Citing the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF), he noted that in 2020, the #LindungAnak initiative, launched by the Malaysian government aimed to increase awareness among children and their parents about the dangers of online exploitation and sexual grooming.

He said despite the campaign, many parents and children still did not know how to recognise grooming or exploitation attempts.

"Teachers and other frontline professionals, like social workers and healthcare providers are often the first to spot signs of abuse, but they are not always adequately trained to detect the subtle signs of grooming.

"Schools need to implement stronger programmes that teach children about online safety, while parents must be equipped with tools to monitor their children's online behaviour.

"More training for teachers, social workers and healthcare professionals is also needed to detect early signs of exploitation and abuse," he told Sinar Daily.

Paneir also outlined urgent reforms to strengthen child protection in Malaysia.

"Adoption laws should be updated to ensure a more transparent and rigorous process.

"Background checks on adoptive parents should be thorough and include psychological evaluations, while post-adoption monitoring should be mandatory and frequent to ensure the child's safety.

"This should include a system where adoption agencies are held accountable and any malpractice is investigated promptly," he said.

He added that Malaysia must expand its digital forensics capabilities and provide specialised training for enforcement units such as DII Sexual, Women and Child Investigation Division to handle online child exploitation more effectively.

"This should include better cooperation with international law enforcement agencies, particularly those focused on tracking dark web activities," Paneir stressed.

Paneir also called for wider public awareness campaigns to help parents and teachers identify risks and ensure timely reporting of abuse, alongside more resources for child protection agencies to strengthen investigations.

Meanwhile, OrphanCare Foundation social worker at the Baby Rescue Department Nuur'ain binti Mohd Kharir said adoption procedures under the local baby hatch were stringent.

"So for couples who want to adopt, it's not as simple as just giving them a baby to take home.

"We also have our own process to ensure, as best as we can, that couples who register with the local baby hatch are genuine, that they truly want to raise and care for the child.

"Because this is a trust. It is also our responsibility to ensure adoptive parents can provide love and everything the child needs to grow up," she said when contacted.

She explained that the local baby hatch followed the Social Welfare Department (JKM) guidelines when processing adoptions.

"But if the baby is placed in our baby hatch and the biological mother is not involved in the adoption process, the baby will become stateless, without citizenship.

"Citizenship has not been determined. So there is a process. After a certain period, the child can get citizenship.

"What we've noticed is that the Home Ministry has approved many of the citizenship applications for our baby hatch children. That means once the adoption process is complete, the adoptive parents must then apply for citizenship.

"So from what we see, many have already been granted citizenship. That is something positive in terms of securing the future of these baby hatch children," she said.

Nuur'ain added that while the local baby hatch enforced strict processes, they were still contacted by non-Malaysian couples.

"We do get enquiries from couples who are not Malaysian citizens, even from outside Malaysia, asking how they can adopt a child from Malaysia. Some even ask if they can adopt a child from Malaysia by paying a certain amount of money.

"So at that point, I have to be firm and say no, we don't do that – because that is actually trafficking. Trafficking of babies and children. So what we know is that the demand is there. But now we cannot do it because there are laws protecting against it," she said.

Experts said while safe adoption systems and campaigns existed, the missing piece was stronger monitoring, training and reforms, because when teachers, parents and frontliners miss the signs, children ultimately pay the price.

NUMBER OF FLOOD VICTIMS RISES TO 3,085

867 families in Sabah and Sarawak affected, says agency

The number of flood victims in Sabah and Sarawak has risen slightly, with 3,085 people evacuated up to yesterday afternoon compared with 3,006 the previous day.

The National Disaster Management Agency (Nadma) said 867 families were affected and placed in 26 relief centres in the two states.

"The Disaster Management Secretariat and the Civil Defence Force said the number of victims in Sabah is 2,967 people in six districts from 827 families.

"In Membakut district, 931 victims were placed in five centres, while Penampang recorded 788 victims in eight centres.

"Putatan was also affected with 564 victims placed in four centres, followed by Beaufort (281 victims, one centre) and Papar (275 victims, two centres)."

Nadma said Sarawak recorded 118 victims involving one newly affected district, Telang Usan, with 66 victims from 24 families placed at one centre.

For large-scale fires, the numbers remained unchanged at 59 victims from 11 families in Tawau, Sabah, and 52 victims from 16 families in Saratok, Sarawak.

The landslide disaster in Sabah involving Papar and Penampang districts saw three centres still operating.

In Papar, 51 victims from 10 families were recorded, while Penampang had 18 victims from four families.

No new deaths were reported.

Hajiji: Let's not think about politics now

PAPAR: Chief Minister Datuk Seri Hajiji Noor has told everyone to set aside politics at a time when the state is being hit by flooding and landslides.

"This is a time for us to show concern about those affected by the disaster, not to highlight our political differences.

"In facing this disaster, all citizens and government agencies must be mobilised to help (those affected). Let's not think about politics right now. Don't let this be turned into an issue."

Hajiji said this at the Kampung Mook relief centre after he visited

the next of kin of those killed in the landslide there.

Present were state Community Development and People's Well-being Minister and health executive councillor Datuk James Rafib and state Industrial Development and Entrepreneurship Minister Datuk Phoong Jin Zhe.

Present were Yayasan Sabah director and Kawang assemblyman Datuk Ghulam Haidar Khan Bahadar, Limbahau assemblyman Datuk Jull Nuatim and State Secretary Datuk Seri Safar Untong.

Hajiji said Sabah was committed to helping the victims by pro-

viding aid, including cash assistance, as well as finding the best solution to overcome the problem.

"The state and federal governments are helping to ease the burden of victims' families.

"We hope this will lighten their load. God willing, we will do our best to ensure the situation can be restored with government assistance."

Up to 8am yesterday, 2,956 flood victims have been recorded in six districts: Beaufort, Penampang, Tawau, Membakut, Papar and Putatan.

Sabah Electricity worker feared drowned

KENINGAU: A Sabah Electricity staff member is feared drowned after being swept away by strong currents in Kampung Nuntunan Apin-Apin on Tuesday night.

Rescue operations are underway.

The victim, a man in his 30s, and two of his colleagues had earlier carried out maintenance work at a substation near a suspension bridge.

They attempted to cross a concrete bridge in the area but were hit by strong currents.

Two reached the riverbank, but the other lost his grip on a rope and was swept away.

Keningau Fire and Rescue Station chief Senior Fire Superintendent Severinus @ Mohd Nidzam Sainkui said his team received an emergency call at 9.57pm.

A rescue team comprising nine

firefighters, along with a fire engine and an Emergency Medical Rescue Services vehicle, were deployed to the location.

Politics paused in Sabah

Hajiji urges unity, tells all parties to focus on flood relief

KOTA KINABALU: Sabah has put politics on hold, with Chief Minister Datuk Seri Hajiji Noor urging all parties to close ranks and unite in helping victims of the recent floods and landslides.

Dismissing talk of the dissolution of the state assembly, Hajiji stressed that both the state and federal governments are focused on providing immediate assistance to those affected.

"We have not thought about dissolving. Let us first help the victims. This is the time to show that political differences are not a barrier."

"In facing disasters, the people and government agencies must work together. Let us not think about politics first, let us not make this an issue," he told reporters during visits to flood and landslide victims in Papar yesterday.

Hajiji was responding to speculation that the State Legislative Assembly would be dissolved this month to pave the way for the 17th state election. The current five-year term of the assembly ends on Nov 11.

During his visit to Kampung Mook, Hajiji extended condolences to Arisothde @ Jude Joseph, whose wife Emily Johnny, 38, and son Karell Myre Arisothde, 11, were killed when their house was flattened in a landslide.

He also paid his last respects to the mother and son.

The affected villagers have been placed at the community hall in the village.

Hajiji said the state government would provide RM10,000 to each family who lost loved ones in the disaster and RM30,000 to rebuild the three houses destroyed in the village.

"From the state and federal governments, we will help. Hopefully, this can ease the burden of the victims' families," he said.

The Chief Minister also visited disaster victims at several tempo-

rary relief centres in Dewan Marahang, Bongawan Community Hall and Salagon in Papar and Beaufort.

Meanwhile, Sabah Barisan Nasional has decided to put its Gelombang Biru (Blue Wave) programme on hold to focus on helping flood and landslide victims in

the state.

The programme, initially scheduled to begin on Sept 21, is meant to project confidence in the coalition's return to governing the state.

Sabah Umno information chief Datuk Suhaimi Nasir said it was inappropriate to hold political

gatherings while many Sabahans were mourning the loss of loved ones and struggling with the disaster.

"Political activities can wait when people are suffering," he said. Suhaimi said Sabah Barisan-Umno has mobilised all its machinery on the ground to assist, deliver aid and offer prayers for those affected.

"We extend our deepest condolences to all families of the victims who perished."

"Their grief is our grief. During this time, we do not see them as voters or supporters of any party. They are our brothers and sisters, our family, the blood of Sabah."

"When a child is sleeping cold in an evacuation centre, when a mother has lost her shelter and when a family is mourning the burial of a loved one, that is where all our energy must be directed," he said in a statement yesterday.

Suhaimi said the Gelombang Biru programme would be resumed at a later date, stressing that humanitarian aid and solidarity must come above politics.

Floods hit schools in Sabah and Sarawak

PETALING JAYA: A total of 53 schools in Sabah and Sarawak have been hit by floods, the Education Ministry said.

It said 24 primary schools and five secondary schools in Sabah, as well as 22 primary schools and two secondary schools in Sarawak, were affected.

The ministry said six temporary evacuation centres are currently operating within its educational premises, with five in Sabah and one in Sarawak.

Emergency aid is being channelled to the affected schools through the respective state education departments, it added.

"Continuous monitoring of the flood situation is being carried to ensure the safety of schoolchildren, teachers and the education community," the ministry said in a statement yesterday.

It also expressed condolences to the families of four pupils who lost their lives in the floods and landslides that struck several areas in Sabah.

Bad weather since Sept 8 has triggered widespread flooding in six districts in Sabah, with Penampang among the worst hit by floods and landslides.

Four landslides have claimed 13 lives in Kota Kinabalu, Penampang and Papar districts over the past five days.

MMEA duo injured in high-speed chase

ALOR GAJAH: Two officers from the Malaysian Maritime Enforcement Agency (MMEA) were injured when their patrol vessel was rammed by a speedboat that is suspected of carrying undocumented migrants.

Malaka and Negri Sembilan MMEA director, Maritime Captain Salehuddin Zakaria, said the high-speed chase occurred at about 8pm on Tuesday near the maritime boundary of Negri Sembilan.

The injured MMEA officers are aged 36 and 34.

Salehuddin said the incident occurred after the Lumut Sea Surveillance System detected a suspicious boat as it was heading towards Tanjung Rhu, off the Sepang coast in Selangor.

"An MMEA patrol boat that was conducting Op Paktor Optima was summoned to intercept the vessel. Upon realising the presence of enforcement assets, the speedboat, fitted with three high-powered engines, acted aggressively during the pursuit and rammed into the left side of the patrol boat, causing severe damage," he said in a statement yesterday.

"The collision left one officer with facial injuries to the nose, while the other sustained injuries to the leg and hand," he said.

No camping in the rain, says Bomba

JOHOR BARU: After two major water surges left almost 1,000 campers stranded in the wee hours of Monday, holidaymakers have been told not to go camping near water bodies, especially during the rainy season.

In the first case, a water surge incident in Kuala Kubu Baru in Selangor at about 5am, saw about 400 people in several campsites along Sungai Kerling affected.

"Luckily, some people were awake and realised that the river level was rising suddenly at 3.30am. They alerted other campers along the river, which stretches for about 1.5km," said Fire and Rescue Department director-general Datuk Seri Nor Hisham Mohammad.

He said firemen were deployed to the area immediately to tell all

the people camping along Sungai Kerling to move to higher ground.

In Perak, a water surge occurred along Sg Simpang 4 Dalam, a popular campsite area, affecting about 500 campers who were there for the long weekend.

Nor Hisham said firemen had to rescue about 46 people who were trapped at a campsite in Kg Simpang 4 in Tanjung Malim after the sudden water surge at about 6am.

"My men had to brave through the flood waters to rescue the people - 26 adults and 20 children," he said, advising those who planned to carry out outdoor camping near water bodies to postpone their trips during the rainy season.

He added that they have to be cautious when setting up camp next to a river or any water body, as the water levels can rise quickly within minutes due to heavy

rain upstream.

On the nationwide flood situation, Nor Hisham said the department had responded to 72 cases between Monday and Tuesday. Most of them were related to fallen trees (35 cases), followed by floods (24), landslips (nine) and two each for drowning and roads cut off.

"Most of the flood cases were in Sabah with 19 cases, followed by three in Perak and one each in Selangor and Penang," he said, adding that the department had already made all the necessary flood preparations.

Nor Hisham also advised parents to be alert about the whereabouts of their children and remind them not to play near rivers, drains, lakes or sewerage plants, especially during the rainy season.

Meanwhile, the department operations commander Saiful

Anmar Ismail from the Tanjung Malim fire station, said Sungai Simpang 4 was popular with campers, especially during 1ng holidays.

"We had to brave through flood waters to reach our victims as the water level was rising fast, and access via a bridge was cut off."

"We used boats to rescue the women and children first," he said, adding that during the incident, several vehicles were damaged in the flood waters, while some camping gear was swept away.

Operations commander Harashid Rusli from the Kuala Kubu Baru fire station said the district had more than 100 campsites.

"Although only eight campsites were affected along Sungai Kerling, we had to go from one area to another to advise people to move out," he said.

"Tujuan sukan ini juga mahu mendidik masyarakat dan ibu bapa bahawa anak-anak istimewa ini sebenarnya berkeupayaan seperti kanak-kanak normal, cuma bakat mereka tidak dicungkil," katanya. - UTUSAN

Mengikuti pertuduhan pertama, tertuduh didakwa merogol pelajar kolej berusia 20 tahun dalam kenderaan utiliti sukan (SUV) yang diparkir tepi jalan Parit Raja di sini, di antara jam 11 malam hingga 1 pagi pada 27 Julai lalu.

Dia didakwa melakukan ke-

salahan itu mengikut Seksyen 376(1) Kanun Keseksaan, yang membawa hukuman penjara sehingga 30 tahun dan sebatan.

Bagi pertuduhan kedua, dia didakwa melakukan hubungan seks dengan mangsa sama, yang mana semua kejadian dan masa juga berlaku di lokasi sama.

Fasilitator motivasi didakwa 'sentuh' pelajar

KANGAR – Seorang fasilitator motivasi mengaku tidak bersalah di Mahkamah Sesyen di sini hari ini atas dua pertuduhan melakukan amang seksual ke atas seorang pelajar sekolah pada Julai lalu.

Tertuduh, Mohd Zulkarnain Atan, 44, membuat pengakuan itu sebaik pertuduhan terhadapnya dibacakan di hadapan Majistret Ana Rozana Mohd Nor.

Kes tersebut didengar di hadapan Majistret Ana Rozana berikutan ketiadaan hakim Mahkamah Sesyen.

Mengikut pertuduhan pertama, tertuduh didakwa menyentuh alat sulit mangsa lelaki berusia 14 tahun di dewan sebuah sekolah menengah di Padang Besar pada pukul 9 pagi, 10 Julai lalu.

Pendakwaan dibuat mengikut Seksyen 14(a) Akta Kesalahan-Kesalahan Seksual Terhadap Kanak-Kanak 2017 yang membawa hukuman penjara maksimum 20 tahun dan sebatan.

Lelaki itu didakwa berkomunikasi secara seksual dengan mangsa sama di lokasi dan masa sama.

Oleh itu, tertuduh melakukan kesalahan di bawah Seksyen 11(1) akta sama yang memperuntukkan hukuman penjara tidak melebihi tiga tahun.

Timbalan Pendakwa Raya, Tengku Ruqayyah Tengku Shahrom menawarkan jaminan sebanyak RM20,000 dengan seorang penjamin.

Tengku Ruqayyah turut memohon supaya tertuduh dikenakan syarat tambahan iaitu tidak mengganggu mangsa dan saksi pendakwaan sehingga kes selesai.

Peguam Yayasan Bantuan Guaman Kebangsaan, Nur Ayuni Ahmad bagaimanapun merayu satu jaminan yang minimum kepada tertuduh.

"Tertuduh tinggal di Kota Tinggi, Johor. Dia bekerja sebagai fasilitator motivasi dengan pendapatan tidak tetap. Dia merupakan duda, menanggung ayah yang sudah tua dan menjaga kakak yang merupakan ibu tunggal," katanya.

Menurutnya, tertuduh turut menghidap penyakit jantung, asma dan masalah tulang belakang. Tertuduh tidak mempunyai sebarang hubungan kekeluargaan dengan mangsa.

Mahkamah menetapkan jaminan sebanyak RM15,000 dengan seorang penjamin dan 16 Oktober ini untuk sebutan semula kes.

Setakat ini tertuduh tidak membayar jaminan.

Pada 2 Februari tahun lalu, tertuduh dihadapkan ke Mahkamah Majistret Ayer Keroh, Melaka atas dua tuduhan mencabul kehormatan dua penuntut lelaki sebuah universiti awam di negeri itu.

Dia bagaimanapun mengaku tidak bersalah dan minta dibicarakan. – KOSMO! ONLINE
